Officers from the secretariats of Parliament undergo study tour in Sri Lanka

A 6 member officers' delegation from the secretariats of the Parliament led by the Secretaries General of the National Assembly and National Council visited Sri Lanka from 3rd to 11th December 2012. The study tour was aimed at orienting the officers on gender and politics from Sri Lankan perspective. During the study tour, the officers were briefed on the status of women in mainstream politics and social cultural arena in Sri Lanka. Interactive sessions were also conducted with gender experts coming from various backgrounds of political science, community services, law and teaching fraternity.

In addition, the delegation visited some of the principal NGOs focused on empowering women and underprivileged children in Sri Lanka and learned about their endeavors and challenges. The study tour was conducted by the MDF Institute for Training and consultancy funded by the UNDP, Bhutan.

Similarly, two groups of Hon'ble MPs and officials from the Parliament also underwent training on gender and politics at Andra Pradesh and New Delhi in India.
