POLICY REVIEW ISSUES – 2

a. Increasing Cost of Construction

It is being reported that a number of new houses constructed in Thimphu, and possibly other urban areas, are being left vacant due to lack of tenants. While it may be too early to conclude that this is the result of a housing boom, it appears quite clear that the houses are remaining unoccupied because of the mismatch between the housing rents charged and the capacity of the tenants to pay. Income levels have remained largely stagnant compared to the rise in the costs of construction. Due to the very steep increase in construction costs, house builders are forced to borrow larger amounts from the banks and therefore, have to charge higher house rents to make up the monthly installments due to the banks. Thus far, banks have not reported very high or alarming levels of Non-Performing Loans (NPL) but with housing loans constituting 26.5% of the total credit, continuation of this scenario for a few more years will lead to pressures on the banking system due to high rate of defaults which will be catastrophic for an economy already suffering from a liquidity and rupee shortages.

Likewise, the government's capital expenditure for the fiscal year 2013-14 is close to Nu. 17 billion, the bulk of which is for construction activities and this does not include hydro-power projects. The slightest increase in construction costs, therefore, has huge implications on the government budget.

Therefore, the issue is raised in the National Council to highlight this particular issue and encourage strategies and recommendations to control such rising costs.
